Keziah⁹ Whitcomb (15174W) (*Simon*, #32) was born on 12 September 1736 in Lancaster, Worcester County, MA.³⁵⁰ She was christened on 3 October 1736 at Worcester County, MA.³⁵¹ She married George Parkhurst (15174) (see #26), son of George Parkhurst (1517) and Tabitha Whitney (Widow Fulham) (Whitney 1623 - 1517W), on 13 March 1755 in Lancaster, Worcester County, MA.³⁵² She died in Town of Fairfield, Herkimer County, NY.³⁵³

She and George Parkhurst (15174) had eight children between 1755 and 1778 in Lancaster, Worcester County, MA. She was most likely a female living when the 1790 Census was taken in the household of George Parkhurst (15174) in Partridgefield, (now Peru), Berkshire County, MA.³⁵⁴ She was most likely living when the 1800 Census was taken in the household of George Parkhurst (15174) in Town of Fairfield, Herkimer County, NY, recorded as Parkhurs.³⁵⁵ She was most likely living when the 1810 Census was taken in the household of George Parkhurst (15174) in Town of Fairfield, Herkimer County, NY.³⁵⁶

28. Charles⁹ Parmenter was born on 21 September 1721 in Sudbury, Middlesex County, MA.³⁵⁷ He married Hannah unknown (see #29).³⁵⁸ He died on 24 February 1802 in Hubbardston, Worcester County, MA, at age 80.³⁵⁹

George¹⁰ Parkhurst (1517) (*John*, #34) was born on 17 January 1686 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.³⁶¹ He married Tabitha Whitney (Widow Fulham) (Whitney 1623 - 1517W) (see #31), daughter of Jonathan Whitney (Whitney 162) and Sarah Hapgood (Whitney 162W), on 19 April 1726 in Weston, Middlesex County, MA, as her second husband.³⁶² He died on 17 March 1735 in Weston, Middlesex County, MA, at age 49.³⁶³

He and Tabitha Whitney (Widow Fulham) (Whitney 1623 - 1517W) had four sons between 1727 and 1733 in Weston, Middlesex County, MA.

Children of George¹⁰ Parkhurst (1517) and Tabitha Whitney (Widow Fulham) (Whitney 1623 - 1517W) (see #31) were as follows:

He and Mary Whittemore (15172.W) were both of Nichewoag (now Petersham) on 20 July 1751.³⁷² Jonathan lived in Winchester and Surry, both located in Cheshire Co., NH. According to the 1925 History of Surry, Jonathan, of Winchester, NH, settled in Surry about 1764 and moved away in 1768. He and Mary Whittemore (15172.W) had nine children between 1752 and 1768. He was enumerated during the 1790 Census in Sharon, Windsor County, VT, probably included in Jonathan's 1790 census household: Mary Whittemore (15172.W).³⁷³ He was enumerated during the 1800 Census in Hardwick, Worcester County, MA, probably included in Jonathan's 1800 census household: Mary Whittemore (15172.W) recorded as Parkust.³⁷⁴ Later in his life, Jonathan lived in Unity and Dresden, ME, according to the Parkhurst Association records. He was enumerated during the 1810 Census in Unity, Kennebec County, ME, probably included in Jonathan's 1810 census household: Mary Whittemore (15172.W).³⁷⁵ He had John Whitney (Whitney 1) as a **royal gateway** ancestor (15 generations from HENRY II King of England, 1154-1189).
- iii. William Parkhurst (15173) was born on 12 April 1731 in Weston, Middlesex County, MA.³⁷⁶ He was christened on 18 April 1731 at Middlesex County, MA.³⁷⁷ He married Martha Perry (15173W), daughter of James Perry and Elizabeth Death, on 3 November 1757 in Holliston, Middlesex County, MA.³⁷⁸ He died after 1800 in Town of Fairfield, Herkimer County, NY.³⁷⁹

He and Martha Perry (15173W) had ten children between 1758 and 1781 in MA. William lived in various parts of western Massachusetts before finally settling in Fairfield, Herkimer Co., NY. He was enumerated during the 1800 Census in Town of Fairfield, Herkimer County, NY, probably included in William's 1800 census household: Martha Perry (15173W) recorded as Parkis.³⁸⁰ He had an extra male 16 to 25 years old and an extra female under 10 years old in his census household in 1800.³⁸¹

- v. Tabitha Parkhurst (15175) was born in Weston, Middlesex County, MA.³⁸²

Tabitha Parkhurst is sometimes shown as a child of George, but it is unlikely that she existed. No information concerning her marriage or death has been found. Tabitha (Whitney) Fulham had a daughter, Tabitha Fulham, during her first marriage to Jacob Fulham. Tabitha Fulham became the wife of Ebenezer Allen, Junior and the mother of his ten children. It seems unlikely that Tabitha (Whitney) Fulham Parkhurst would name a second daughter Tabitha.

She and Sergeant Jacob Fulham (Whitney 1623W) had four children between 1717 and 1725 in Weston, Middlesex County, MA. Jacob was killed in the aggressive engagement with the Indians known as Lovell's Fight. She and George Parkhurst (1517) had four sons between 1727 and 1733 in Weston, Middlesex County, MA. She and Samuel Hunt (Whitney 1623Y) did not have any children.

34. John¹¹ Parkhurst (151) (*George*, #38) was born on 10 June 1644 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.⁴¹¹ He married Abigail Garfield (151W) (see #35), daughter of Edward Garfield and Rebecca Johnson?, circa 1670 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.⁴¹² He died on 12 September 1725 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA, at age 81.⁴¹³

According to the Suffolk Co. Deeds Book 1, page 78, William Page, with wife Anne, took John, son of George Parkhurst, Junior, to bring up in 1646. John spent his entire adult life in Watertown, MA. His name is on the "returns" (of men eligible for military service) during King Philip's War in 1675. Fifty-eight years later his son, John, received a land grant for this service. At the annual

town meeting held 4 Nov 1678, he was chosen one of the two hogreeves (responsible for the prevention or appraising of damages by stray swine) for the coming year. The next year he was again so appointed, with the regulation of fences added to his duties. John was a Watertown selectman in 1694 and 1695. He was admitted a freeman on 18 April 1690 from Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.⁴¹⁴ He and Abigail Garfield (151W) had nine children between 1672 and 1690 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.⁴¹⁵ No gravestone has been found for either John or his wife.

Children of John¹¹ Parkhurst (151) and Abigail Garfield (151W) (see #35) were as follows:

- i. Deacon John¹⁰ Parkhurst (1511) was born on 26 February 1671/72 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.⁴¹⁶ He married Abigail Morse (1511W), daughter of Deacon John Morse and Abigail Stearns, circa 1694 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.⁴¹⁷ He died on 27 May 1764 in Watertown Farms, (now Weston), Middlesex County, MA, at age 92.⁴¹⁸

John settled in Watertown Farms, now Weston, MA. He was an original member and one of the first deacons of the Weston church having been elected on 4 January 1709/10. He served until his resignation on 29 June 1741. He and Abigail Morse (1511W) had ten children between 1695 and 1715 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA. John was a successful farmer and caring father who provided for all of his sons. He bought a farm for his oldest son, John in Pomfret, CT. On 21 January 1734/5, John gave to each of his two youngest sons, Isaac and Jonas, by deed of gift, 80.5 acres of land in Mendon, MA, which he had bought from Caleb Gardner, who was then of Newport, RI. His other son, Josiah remained in Weston and inherited his father's farm.
- ii. Abigail Parkhurst (1512) was born on 10 September 1674 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.⁴¹⁹

No further record of Abigail has been found. She probably died young.
- iii. Elizabeth Parkhurst (1515) was born on 18 September 1681 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.⁴²⁷ She married Joseph Ball (1515W), son of John Ball and Sarah Bullard, on 31 December 1701 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.⁴²⁸ She died on 23 December 1732 in Weston, Middlesex County, MA, at age 51.⁴²⁹

She and Joseph Ball (1515W) had nine children between 1702 and 1722 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.
- vi. Mary Parkhurst (1516) was born on 23 December 1683 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.⁴³⁰ She married Edward Sanderson (1516W), son of Jonathan Sanderson and Abia Bartlett, on 1 May 1707 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.⁴³¹ She died on 5 May 1776 in Waltham, Middlesex County, MA, at age 92.⁴³²

She and Edward Sanderson (1516W) had two daughters between 1710 and 1713 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.
30. vii. George Parkhurst (1517).
- viii. Samuel Parkhurst (1518) was born on 11 April 1688 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.⁴³³ He married Sarah Shattuck (1518W), daughter of Doctor Phillip Shattuck and Rebecca Chamberlain, on 29 May 1716 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.⁴³⁴ He died on 2 September 1768 in Waltham, Middlesex County, MA, at age 80.⁴³⁵

He and Sarah Shattuck (1518W) had nine children between 1717 and 1738 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA. Samuel lived all his life on the old family homestead in the part of Watertown, MA that became part of Waltham, MA. He was a Selectman of Watertown in 1746 and 1747.
- ix. Hannah Parkhurst (1519) was born on 17 April 1690 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.⁴³⁶ She married John Newton (1519W), son of John Newton and Hannah Morse, on 17 January 1717 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.⁴³⁷ She died on 24 February 1754 in Southborough, Worcester County, MA, at age 63.⁴³⁸

She and John Newton (1519W) had nine children between 1718 and 1733 in Marlborough, Middlesex County, MA.

35. Abigail¹¹ Garfield (151W) (*Edward*, #40) was born on 29 June 1646 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.^{439,440} She married John Parkhurst (151) (see #34), son of George Parkhurst (15) and Sarah Browne (15W), circa 1670 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.⁴⁴¹ She died on 18 October 1726 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA, at age 80.⁴⁴²

Abigail's brother, Benjamin, was an ancestor of President Garfield. Abigail's sister, Rebecca, was an ancestor of Brigham Young. She and John Parkhurst (151) had nine children between 1672 and 1690 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.⁴⁴³

36. Jonathan¹¹ Whitney (Whitney 162) (*Jonathan*, #42) was born on 20 October 1658 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.⁴⁴⁴ He married Sarah Hapgood (Whitney 162W) (see #37), daughter of Shadrach Hapgood and Elizabeth Treadway, in 1691 in Sudbury, Middlesex County, MA.⁴⁴⁵ He died on 17 March 1735 in Concord, Middlesex County, MA, at age 76.⁴⁴⁶ His estate was probated on 18 March 1735 at Concord, Middlesex County, MA.⁴⁴⁷

He and Sarah Hapgood (Whitney 162W) had 12 children between 1694 and 1710 in Middlesex County, MA.⁴⁴⁸ Jonathan Whitney's (Whitney 162) will was dated on Monday 14 March 1735 at Concord, Middlesex County, MA.⁴⁴⁹

(see #41) circa 1634 as his second wife.⁴⁷⁴ He married Joanna unknown (Widow Buckmaster) on 1 September 1661 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA, as his third wife and her second husband.⁴⁷⁵ He died on 14 June 1672 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA, at age 88.⁴⁷⁶ His estate was probated on 16 July 1672 at Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.⁴⁷⁷

He immigrated in 1634 to Watertown, Middlesex County, MA, traveling with him were Samuel Garfield and Sarah Garfield (15X).⁴⁷⁸ He was admitted a freeman on 6 May 1635 from Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.⁴⁷⁹ Edward Garfield's will was dated on Sunday 30 December 1668 at Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.⁴⁸⁰ Edward's age at death given as 97 years was an over statement.

42. Jonathan¹² Whitney (Whitney 16) (*John*, #52) was born circa 1634 in England.⁴⁹⁷ He married Lydia Jones (Whitney 16W) (see #43), daughter of Lewis Jones and Anna Stone, on 30 October 1656 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.⁴⁹⁸ He died circa 1702 in Sherburne, Middlesex County, MA.⁴⁹⁹

He immigrated along with John Whitney (Whitney 1) and Elinor unknown (Whitney 1W) in June 1635 to Watertown, Middlesex County, MA, on the ship Elizabeth and Ann.⁵⁰⁰ He and Lydia Jones (Whitney 16W) had 11 children between 1657 and 1678 in Middlesex County, MA.⁵⁰¹

Interesting ancestry. He had John Whitney (Whitney 1) as a **royal gateway** ancestor (15 generations from HENRY II King of England, 1154-1189).

44. Shadrach¹² Hapgood was born in Southampton, England.⁵⁰⁵ He married Elizabeth Treadway (see #45) on 21 October 1664.⁵⁰⁶ He died on 2 August 1675 in Brookfield, Worcester County, MA.⁵⁰⁷

45. Elizabeth¹² Treadway was born on 3 April 1646 in Sudbury, Middlesex County, MA.⁵⁰⁸ She married Shadrach Hapgood (see #44) on 21 October 1664.⁵⁰⁹ She married Joseph Hayward in 1677.⁵¹⁰

Generation Thirteen

46. George¹³ Parkhurst (1 & C1-8c) (*John*, #56) was born in 1588 in Ipswich, Suffolk, England.⁵¹¹ He married Phebe Leete (1W & C1-9g) (see #47), daughter of Robert Leete (C1-18 = D3-1) and Alice Grundy (C1-19 = D4-1), circa 1611 in England as his first wife.⁵¹² He married Susanna unknown (Widow Simson) (1X) between 9 November 1643 and 16 November 1644 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA, as his second wife and her second husband.⁵¹³ He died before 18 June 1675 in Ipswich, Suffolk, England.⁵¹⁴ He was buried on 18 June 1675 in Ipswich, Saint Laurence Parish, Suffolk, England.⁵¹⁵

George was born during 1588 possibly in May, probably in Ipswich, England. He was a son of John Parkhurst (A) and his wife Sarah unknown (AW). George and his wife, Phebe Leete, lived in Ipswich where their nine children were baptized, but after the last child was baptized there is no record of them in Ipswich and they may have lived elsewhere until George appears on record in New England.

George's arrival date in New England can be estimated by the marriages contracted by his children in Massachusetts prior to 1640. George, his family and his wife's brother-in-law, the Reverend Timothy Dalton, and Dalton's family were very probably in the group of people from Ipswich, England that arrived on three ships in Boston, MA on 20 June 1637.

George first appears on record in New England at Watertown, MA in 1642 when it was ordered that a highway should be laid out to his house. He is not mentioned in the four grants of land made in Watertown between 25 July 1636 and 9 April 1638. He may have lived elsewhere in New England before moving to Watertown.

Whether he brought with him his wife, Phebe, when he came to New England is unknown. However, it seems likely that his wife did come as part of the group from Ipswich that included her sister, Ruth, and Ruth's husband, Reverend Timothy Dalton. She probably died not long after their arrival in New England, because about 1644, George married his second wife, Susanna Simson, the widow of John Simson.

The time period when George and Susanna were married can be determined by John Simson's burial at Watertown on 10 June 1643 and by the sales of Simson's real estate. Susanna held title after John's death and deeded some of the land on 9 November 1643. George sold two acres of Simson's land on 16 November 1644, having acquired title by his marriage to Susanna. Therefore, George and Susanna were married between 9 November 1643 and 16 November 1644. They were living in Boston by 1645 as evidenced by a deed George made there on 4 October 1645 selling six more acres in Watertown.

On 13 June 1655, George sold the last 12 acres of what had been John Simson's land for 21 pounds. This conveyance was made by permission of the General Court, granted 23 May 1655, in response to his petition in which he asserts that he was then "near 67 years old", that he and his wife, who was in England, and most of her children were in destitute condition, that she had had 10 children during her 20 years of residence in America - seven sons and three daughters (at John Simson's death, he left two sons and three daughters; therefore she had five sons by Parkhurst), that she had gone to London, England with six of her children but found her mother, brothers and sisters were unable to provide the support she had expected, that four of her children had remained in America, and that the petitioner desired to sell the land (apparently all that remained) in order that he might go to the aid of his wife. George probably returned to England as soon as possible after signing the deed of 13 June 1655, his last act on record in New England.

George was probably the "Old George Parkhurst" buried 18 June 1675 at Saint Laurence, Ipswich, England. He may have been living with his cousin, Nathaniel Parkhurst, who had six hearths in the Suffolk Hearth Tax of 1674.^{516,517}

Children of George¹³ Parkhurst (1 & C1-8c) and Phebe Leete (1W & C1-9g) (see #47) were as follows:

Phebe's first marriage took place at Woolverstone, the home of her Aunt Ruth (Leete) Dalton near Ipswich.⁵²³ Phebe's second marriage may have been in March 1640. She and Thomas Arnold (11X) had five children between 1641 and 1651 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.
- ii. Mary Parkhurst (12) was born before 28 August 1614 in Ipswich, Suffolk, England.⁵²⁴ She was christened on 28 August 1614 at Ipswich, Saint Laurence Parish, Suffolk, England.⁵²⁵ She married Reverend Thomas Carter (12W), son of James Carter and Mary unknown, between 1638 and 1639 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.^{526,527} She died on 28 March 1687 in Woburn, Middlesex County, MA, at age 72.⁵²⁸

She and Reverend Thomas Carter (12W) had eight children between 1640 and 1655 in Middlesex County, MA.

Mary's husband, Thomas Carter, was living in Watertown, MA before 1637. Mary's first child was born early in August 1640 in Watertown. This places Mary in Watertown by 1639. She probably arrived with her father and some of her siblings and this helps to date the arrival time of George and his family to before 1639.
- iii. Samuel Parkhurst (13) was born before 2 February 1616/17 in Ipswich, Suffolk, England.⁵²⁹ He was christened on 2 February 1616/17 at Ipswich, Saint Margaret Parish, Suffolk, England.⁵³⁰ He died before 1641 in England, probably.⁵³¹

Samuel probably died young in England since he was not mentioned in his Aunt Ruth (Leete) Dalton's will.⁵³²
- iv. Deborah Parkhurst (14) was born before 1 August 1619 in Ipswich, Suffolk, England.⁵³³ She was christened on 1 August 1619 at Ipswich, Saint Margaret Parish, Suffolk, England.⁵³⁴ She married John Smith (14W) circa 1638 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.⁵³⁵ She died circa 1686 in Edgartown, Dukes County, MA.⁵³⁶

Deborah probably married at Watertown, MA shortly after she arrived with her family in New England.⁵³⁷ She and John Smith (14W) had five children between 1640 and 1662.

- vi. John Parkhurst (16) was born before 19 October 1623 in Ipswich, Suffolk, England.⁵³⁸ He was christened on 19 October 1623 at Ipswich, Saint Margaret Parish, Suffolk, England.⁵³⁹ He died before 1641 in England, probably.⁵⁴⁰

John probably died young in England since he was not mentioned in his Aunt Ruth (Leete) Dalton's will.⁵⁴¹
- vii. Abigail Parkhurst (17) was born before 1 January 1625/26 in Ipswich, Suffolk, England.⁵⁴² She was christened on 1 January 1625/26 at Ipswich, Saint Margaret Parish, Suffolk, England.⁵⁴³ She died before 1641 in England, probably.⁵⁴⁴

Abigail probably died young in England since she was not mentioned in her Aunt Ruth (Leete) Dalton's will.⁵⁴⁵

- viii. Elizabeth Parkhurst (18) was born before 18 May 1628 in Ipswich, Saint Margaret Parish, Suffolk, England.⁵⁴⁶ She was christened on 18 May 1628 at Ipswich, Saint Mary-le-Tower Parish, Suffolk, England.⁵⁴⁷ She married Emanuel Hill(i)ard (18W) circa 1650 in Hampton, Rockingham County, NH, as her first husband.⁵⁴⁸ She married Joseph Merry (18X) on 14 December 1659 in Hampton, Rockingham County, NH, as her second husband and his second wife.⁵⁴⁹

Elizabeth was probably living with her Aunt Ruth (Leete) Dalton in Hampton, NH prior to her first marriage in 1650. She and Emanuel Hill(i)ard (18W) had four children between 1651 and 1656 in Hampton, Rockingham County, NH. She moved to Martha's Vineyard in 1670 with her second husband. She and Joseph Merry (18X) had four children between 1660 and 1669 in Hampton, Rockingham County, NH. It is not known when she died.

- ix. Joseph Parkhurst (19 & C1-4i) was born before 21 December 1629 in Ipswich, Suffolk, England.⁵⁵⁰ He was christened on 21 December 1629 at Ipswich, Saint Margaret Parish, Suffolk, England.⁵⁵¹ He married Rebecca Reade (19W & C1-5d), daughter of Esdras Reade (C1-10) and Elizabeth Watson (C1-11), on 26 June 1656 in Concord, Middlesex County, MA.⁵⁵² He died on 30 November 1709 in Chelmsford, Middlesex County, MA, at age 79.⁵⁵³

Joseph came to Watertown, MA before 1640 with his father and siblings. Joseph was a proprietor (original settler) of the New Field (a new district or "town") in Chelmsford, MA and was allotted 12 acres on 12 March 1666/7. His house lot was located "west by town highway to the mill, north by land of Thomas Sewell, east by town common, south by land of John Wright". This location is now on Stedman Street, Lowell, MA.

On the ministerial tax list of 1672, Joseph was listed with eight acres, three cows, two oxen (1 - 2 years old), two yearlings, five swine, and one horse. Sometime later Joseph moved to the Stoney Brook district, which is now in Westford, MA where he died. He and Rebecca Reade (19W & C1-5d) had five children between 1657 and 1671 in Chelmsford, Middlesex County, MA.

47. Phebe¹³ Leete (1W & C1-9g) (*Robert*, #58) was born before 20 December 1585 in Little Eversden, Cambridgeshire, England.⁵⁵⁴ She was christened on 20 December 1585 at Little Eversden, Little Eversden Parish, Cambridgeshire, England.⁵⁵⁵ She married George Parkhurst (1 & C1-8c) (see #46), son of John Parkhurst (A & C1-16 = D1-1) and Sarah unknown (AW & C1-17 = D2-1), circa 1611 in England as his first wife.⁵⁵⁶ She died before 1644 in New England probably.⁵⁵⁷

Phebe (Phebe "unknown" or Phebe "Mathers" in some early Parkhurst genealogies) was the youngest of seven children. She had a sister, Ruth, wife of Reverend Timothy Dalton, Rector of Woolverstone, which is five miles from Ipswich, England. Timothy Dalton and Ruth Leete were married on 13 June 1615 at Gislegham, Suffolk. Ruth died in New Hampshire without surviving children and left legacies to six of the Parkhurst children of her sister, Phebe, but nothing to Phebe's children Samuel, John, and Abigail which suggests that they had died young.⁵⁵⁸

Selected cousins. She and Governor William Leete (Governor of CT) were first cousins once removed. Their common ancestors were John Leete (D3-2) and Ellen Burgoyne (D3-3).

48. He immigrated in 1631 to Watertown, Middlesex County, MA, traveling with him were Sarah Browne (15W), Hannah Browne, and Lydia unknown.⁵⁶⁶ He was admitted a freeman on 6 March 1632 from Watertown, Middlesex County, MA.⁵⁶⁷ He was a surveyor. The inventory of Abraham Brown(e)'s estate was taken on 1 October 1650 Middlesex County, MA.⁵⁶⁸

50. Thomas¹³ Garfield (*Edward*, #62) was born in England.⁵⁷⁶ He married Agnes unknown (see #51) circa 1582 in England.⁵⁷⁷

John¹³ Whitney (Whitney 1) (*Thomas*, #64) was born before 20 July 1591 in Westminster, St. Margaret's Parish, Middlesex, England.⁵⁸¹ He was christened on 20 July 1591 at Westminster, St. Margaret's Parish, Middlesex, England.⁵⁸² He married Elinor unknown (Whitney 1W) (see #53) circa 1618 in England as his first wife.⁵⁸³ He died on 1 June 1673 in Watertown, Middlesex County, MA, at age 81.⁵⁸⁴

He and Elinor unknown (Whitney 1W) immigrated in June 1635 to Watertown, Middlesex County, MA, on the ship Elizabeth and Ann traveling with them were John Whitney (Whitney 12), Richard Whitney (Whitney 13), Nathaniel Whitney (Whitney 14), Thomas Whitney (Whitney 15), and Jonathan Whitney (Whitney 16).⁵⁸⁵ He and Elinor unknown (Whitney 1W) had nine children between 1619 and 1643. He was a "Royal Gateway" person who had **royal ancestry** (15 generations from HENRY II King of England, 1154-1189).

Christopher Parkhrst [sic] is first on record on 2 May 1546 on a tax list of Saint Mary's parish, Guildford, Surrey. He was assessed 4 pence for goods and 20 pence for lands and tenements. By a 1550 Feet of Fine, he and his sister sold land to his brother-in-law, probably property which he had inherited from his father. Probably his mother had died at that time and this was the final settlement of the estate. In 1561 Christopher Parkhurst (C7 = B) was named Keeper of the Bishop's Palace in Ipswich, Suffolk, England by his brother, who had been appointed Bishop of Norwich the year before.

Christopher Parkhurst had a second set of children. This is apparent from the will of Bishop John Parkhurst, in which he expressed concern about the education of his nephew Christopher, son of his brother Christopher. The nephew was thus surely underage at the time (1573-4), and was perhaps born about 1572.

Later that year he was chosen as a Hallwarden. This office had the responsibility of the actual fabric of the Guild Hall as well as the collection of sums due to the Guild Merchant for Admissions, etc. Two men usually served together. A century later, they were Borough Treasurers. The office of Hallwarden dates back to at least 1361. The medieval Guildhall is still standing on High Street. This compiler visited the site in 2000.

William was the natural son of King HENRY II 'Curt Mantel' King of England, 1154-1189 and one of his mistresses, Ida, who later became the wife of Roger Bigod, 2nd Earl of Norfolk.

HENRY II 'Curt Mantel'²⁷ of England (King of England) (*Geoffrey of Anjou*, #102) was born on 5 March 1132/33 in Le Mans, Maine, (now France).^{822,823} He married Eleanor of Aquitaine (Duchess of Aquitaine), daughter of William VIII (or X) of Poitou (Count of Poitou) and Eleanor of Chastellerault (Countess Consort of Poitou), on 18 May 1152 in Bordeaux, Gironde, France, as her second husband.⁸²⁴ He died on 6 July 1189 in Chinon Castle, Indre-et-Loire, Normandy, (now France), at age 56.⁸²⁵ He was buried in 1189 in Fontevrault Abbey, Fontevraud-l'Abbaye near Chinon, Anjou, (now France).⁸²⁶

He was also known as HENRY II Fitz Geoffrey.⁸²⁷ He was also known as HENRY II Fitz Empress. He and Eleanor of Aquitaine (Duchess of Aquitaine) were fourth **cousins**. (**Caveat: joining of two ancestral paths**). Their common ancestors were ROBERT II 'The Pious' of France (King of France) and Constance of Provence (Queen Consort of France). He and Eleanor of Aquitaine (Duchess of Aquitaine) were crowned together by Archbishop Theobald of Canterbury on 7 December 1154 in Westminster Abbey, London, London, England.⁸²⁸

11th Duke of Normandy, 1149 - 1189

King of England, 25 October 1154 - 6 July 1189

HENRY II (1133-1189), King of England from 25 October 1154 until 6 July 1189, first monarch of the house of Anjou or Plantagenet, son of Geoffrey Plantagenet, Count of Anjou, and of Matilda, daughter of King HENRY I of England. He was sometimes called 'Curt Mantel' because of the short Angevin mantel he wore. In 1150 he was made Duke of Normandy. The following year, on his father's death he inherited Geoffrey's Angevin territories. By his marriage in 1152 to Eleanor of Aquitaine, divorced wife of King LOUIS VII of France, Henry added Guienne, (Aquitaine), and lands in south France to his possessions. Through his mother, who had been designated her father's heiress but was deprived of his succession by STEPHEN of Blois, HENRY II claimed the English kingship. In 1153 he defeated the armies of STEPHEN in England and compelled the king to choose him as his successor; on the death of STEPHEN in the following year, HENRY II became king. During the first few years of his reign HENRY II devoted himself to quelling the disorder that had developed during STEPHEN's reign and to enlarging his English possessions. He regained some north counties previously ceded to King Malcolm IV of Scotland and conquered Wales.

From 1157 until 1180 HENRY II was involved in conflict with King LOUIS VII of France over French provinces to which HENRY II laid claim. Meanwhile, he carried on a quarrel with Thomas Becket, Archbishop of Canterbury, concerning ecclesiastical courts. The dispute began in 1163 over the question of trying "criminous clerks", or ecclesiastics accused of crime. By the Constitutions of Clarendon, the supreme authority was fixed in the royal, not the ecclesiastical, courts. Thomas Becket refused to approve the Constitutions and was accordingly so persecuted that he fled to France in 1170. Fearing papal interdiction on his dominions, HENRY II effected a reconciliation with the archbishop, who returned to England in 1170. Before the question of the "criminous clerks" could be settled, Becket was murdered by four knights loyal to HENRY II but not acting on his orders. Nevertheless, HENRY II was held responsible and probably undertook the conquest of Ireland at that time to temporarily escape censure. As a result of the murder, HENRY II had to accede on the question of ecclesiastical authority and in 1174 had to perform penance at the archbishop's shrine.

From 1173 until his death HENRY II was troubled by a succession of rebellions headed by his sons and furthered by PHILIPPE II King of France, 1180 - 1223 and by Queen Eleanor, who was hostile to her husband because of his faithlessness. Despite the internecine strife, caused partly by the Becket affair and partly by the king's close-handed distribution of lands and titles to his sons, he did not lose the loyalty of his people. HENRY II's death was hastened by the discovery that his favorite son and erstwhile ally, JOHN, was secretly aiding his son and heir apparent, RICHARD, and RICHARD's allies against him.

HENRY II made a number of valuable administrative reforms, especially in the judicial branch of the government during his reign. He was succeeded by his son, RICHARD I King of England, 1189 - 1199.

Children of HENRY II 'Curt Mantel'²⁷ of England (King of England) and Ida de Toeni (Mistress of HENRY II) (see #99) were:

100. William²⁷ Fitz Patrick (2nd Earl of Salisbury) was born circa 1150.⁸³⁰ He married Eleanor de Vitre (see #101), daughter of Robert de Vitre.⁸³¹ He died on 17 April 1196.⁸³²

Children of William²⁷ Fitz Patrick (2nd Earl of Salisbury) and Eleanor de Vitre (see #101) were:

97. i. Ela²⁶ d'Evereux (Countess of Salisbury).

101. Eleanor²⁷ de Vitre (*Robert*, #104) married William Fitz Patrick (2nd Earl of Salisbury) (see #100).⁸³³

Geoffrey V of Anjou

102. Geoffrey V 'Plantagenet'²⁸ of Anjou (Count of Anjou and Maine) (*Fulk of Jerusalem*, #105) was born on 24 August 1113 in Anjou, France.⁸³⁴ He married Matilda of England (Holy Roman Empress Consort) (see #103), daughter of HENRY I 'Beauclerc' of England (King of England) and Matilda of Scotland (Queen Consort of England), on 22 May 1127 as her second husband.⁸³⁵ He remarried Matilda of England (Holy Roman Empress Consort), daughter of HENRY I 'Beauclerc' of England (King of England) and Matilda of Scotland (Queen Consort of England), on 17 June 1128 in Le Mans, Maine, (now France).⁸³⁶ He died on 7 September 1151 in Chateau-du-Loir, Le Mans, Maine, (now France), at age 38.^{837,838} He was buried in 1151 in St. Julien's, Le Mans, Maine, (now France).⁸³⁹

He was also known as Geoffrey V Plantagenet.⁸⁴⁰

Geoffrey became Count of Anjou in 1129 after his father, Fulk V, a crusader, had gone to Jerusalem.

10th Duke of Normandy, 1136 - 1149

During 1142 and 1143, Geoffrey secured all of Normandy west and south of the Seine, and, on 14 January 1144, he crossed the Seine and entered Rouen. In 1144, he founded an Augustine priory at Chateau-l'Ermitage in Anjou. Geoffrey held the duchy until 1149, when he and Matilda conjointly ceded it to their son, HENRY II, which cession was formally ratified by LOUIS VII King of France the following year.

Geoffrey also put down three baronial rebellions in Anjou, in 1129, 1135, and 1145-1151. He was often at odds with his younger brother, Elias, whom he had imprisoned until 1151.

Geoffrey had a son, Hamelin Plantagenet, ca. 1144 and two daughters, Emme and Mary by a mistress or mistresses, name(s) unknown.

Geoffrey V 'Plantagenet' of Anjou (Count of Anjou and Maine) and Matilda of England (Holy Roman Empress Consort) were the parents of HENRY II 'Curt Mantel' King of England, 25 October 1154 - 6 July 1189.

Children of Geoffrey V 'Plantagenet'²⁸ of Anjou (Count of Anjou and Maine) and Matilda of England (Holy Roman Empress Consort) (see #103) were as follows:

98. i. HENRY II 'Curt Mantel'²⁷ of England (King of England).
- ii. Geoffrey VI Plantagenet (Count of Nantes) was born circa 1 June 1134 in Rouen, Normandy, (now France).^{841,842} He died on 26 July 1158.⁸⁴³
He did not have any issue.⁸⁴⁴

Count of Nantes, 1134 - 1158.

- iii. William Plantagenet (Count of Poitou) was born on 21 July 1136 in Argentan.⁸⁴⁵ He died on 30 January 1163/64 in Rouen, Normandy, (now France), at age 27.⁸⁴⁶ He was buried in 1164 in Rouen Cathedral, Rouen, Normandy, (now France).⁸⁴⁷

He was also known as William Longespee.⁸⁴⁸ He was also known as William Fitz Empress.⁸⁴⁹

Count of Poitou, 1136 - 1164.

103. Matilda²⁸ of England (Holy Roman Empress Consort) (*HENRY*, #107) was born on 7 February 1102 in London, London, England.^{850,851} She married HENRY V of Germany (Holy Roman Emperor), son of HENRY IV of Germany (Holy Roman Emperor) and Bertha of Turin (Queen Consort of Germany), on 7 January 1114 in Worms as her first husband.^{852,853,854} She married Geoffrey V 'Plantagenet' of Anjou (Count of Anjou and Maine) (see #102), son of Fulk V 'The Young' of Jerusalem (King of Jerusalem) and Erembourg of Maine (Queen Consort of Jerusalem), on 22 May 1127 as her second husband.⁸⁵⁵ She remarried Geoffrey V 'Plantagenet' of Anjou (Count of Anjou and Maine), son of Fulk V 'The Young' of Jerusalem (King of Jerusalem) and Erembourg of Maine (Queen Consort of Jerusalem), on 17 June 1128 in Le Mans, Maine, (now France).⁸⁵⁶ She died on 10 September 1167 in Rouen, Normandy, (now France), at age 65.^{857,858} She was buried in 1167 in Bec Abbey.⁸⁵⁹

She was also known as Maud of England.⁸⁶⁰ She and HENRY V of Germany (Holy Roman Emperor) did not have any surviving children.

Holy Roman Empress Consort, 1114 - 1125

Duchess Consort of Normandy, 1136-1149

When she was seven years old, Maud was betrothed to HENRY V, Holy Roman Emperor, and was sent to Germany in 1111 to begin her training as his consort. Maud and HENRY V were married at Worms on January 7, 1114 in a splendid ceremony. In March 1116 Maud and HENEY V visited Rome and Tuscany, and she later acted as Regent in his absence. The Imperial couple allegedly had no surviving offspring; Hermann of Tournai, however, states that Maud bore a child that lived only a short while (some have theorized that this child may have in fact been Thomas Becket, subsequently raised by his foster parents: Gilbert Becket and Rosea or/and Matilda de Caen). When Henry died in 1125, he left Maud a "childless" widow of twenty-three. Her brother William Adelin had perished several years before in the wreck of the White Ship (25 November 1120), leaving Maud the only legitimate heir to the English throne.

Maud returned to England, where her father named her his heir, and arranged another marriage for her. In 1127, she was married again, at Le Mans in Anjou, to Geoffrey of Anjou, who was eleven years her junior. He was nicknamed "Plantagenet" from the broom flower (*planta genista*) which he took as his emblem, hence the name of the line of English kings descended from him. The marriage was not a happy one, and Maud separated from him and returned to her father. She returned to Geoffrey in 1131, and they were reconciled. They produced three sons, the eldest of whom, HENRY, was born on March 5, 1133. The birth of her second son, Geoffrey, Count of Nantes, in 1134 was difficult and Maud nearly died in childbed. Her father King HENRY I came to visit and took "great delight" in his grandsons. King HENRY I and Geoffrey quarreled, and so when her father died on December 1, 1135 in Normandy, Maud was with Geoffrey in Anjou.

On the death of her father in 1135, Maud expected to succeed to the throne of England, but her cousin, Stephen of Blois usurped the throne, breaking an oath he had previously made to defend her rights. The civil war which followed was bitter and prolonged.

She retired to Rouen, in Normandy, during her last years, where she maintained her own court. She intervened in the quarrels between her eldest son HENRY II and her second son Geoffrey, but peace between the brothers was brief. Geoffrey rebelled against HENRY II twice before his sudden death in 1158. Relations between HENRY II and his youngest brother, William, were more cordial, and William was given vast estates in England. Archbishop Thomas Becket refused to allow William to marry the Countess of Surrey and the young man fled to Maud's court at Rouen. William, who was his mother's favorite child, died there in January 1164, reportedly of disappointment and sorrow. She attempted to mediate in the quarrel between her son HENRY II and Thomas Becket, but was unsuccessful.

Matilda of England (Holy Roman Empress Consort) and Geoffrey V 'Plantagenet' of Anjou (Count of Anjou and Maine) were the parents of HENRY II 'Curt Mantel' King of England, 25 October 1154 - 6 July 1189.

104. Robert²⁸ de Vitre.

Children of Robert²⁸ de Vitre and an unknown spouse were:

105. Fulk V 'The Young'²⁹ of Jerusalem (King of Jerusalem) was born in 1092.⁸⁶¹ He married Erembourg of Maine (Queen Consort of Jerusalem) (see #106), daughter of Helias of Maine (Count of Maine) and Matilda of Chateau-du-Loire (Countess Consort of Maine), in 1110.⁸⁶² He died on 10 November 1143 in Jerusalem, Holy Land.⁸⁶³

Fulk was Count of Anjou and King of Jerusalem.

Children of Fulk V 'The Young'²⁹ of Jerusalem (King of Jerusalem) and Erembourg of Maine (Queen Consort of Jerusalem) (see #106) were as follows:

- i. Matilda²⁸ of Anjou married William 'The Atheling' of England (Prince of England), son of HENRY I 'Beauclerc' of England (King of England) and Matilda of Scotland (Queen Consort of England), in June 1119.⁸⁶⁴
- ii. Sibylla of Anjou (Countess Consort of Flanders) was born in 1112.⁸⁶⁵ She married William 'The Clito' of England (Count of Flanders), son of Robert II 'Curthose' of England (8th Duke of Normandy) and Sibylla of Conversano (Duchess Consort of Normandy), either 1122 or 1123 as her first husband.⁸⁶⁶ She married Thierry I of Flanders (Count of Flanders), son of Thierry II 'The Valiant' of Lorraine (Duke of Lorraine) and Gertrude of Flanders (Duchess Consort of Lorraine), in 1134 as his second wife and her second husband.^{867,868} She died in 1165 in Bethany, Holy Land.⁸⁶⁹

Sibylla's and William 'The Clito's' marriage was annulled in 1124 by Pope Honorius II.⁸⁷⁰

Countess Consort of Flanders, 1134 - 1165.

Sibylla of Anjou (Countess Consort of Flanders) and Thierry I of Flanders (Count of Flanders) were grandparents of Isabella of Hainaut and Flanders (1170 - 1190) wife of PHILIPPE II 'Augustus' King of France, 1180 - 1223.

Sibylla of Anjou (Countess Consort of Flanders) and Thierry I of Flanders (Count of Flanders) were paternal ancestors of Governor Thomas Dudley (1576 - 1653) of Yaedley Hastings, Northamptonshire, England and Roxbury, Essex County, Massachusetts.

102. iii. Geoffrey V 'Plantagenet' of Anjou (Count of Anjou and Maine).

106. Erembourg²⁹ of Maine (Queen Consort of Jerusalem) married Fulk V 'The Young' of Jerusalem (King of Jerusalem) (see #105), son of Fulk IV 'Rechin' of Anjou (Count of Anjou) and Bertrade of Montfort l'Amauri (Countess Consort of Anjou), in 1110.⁸⁷¹ She died in 1126.⁸⁷²



HENRY I 'Beauclerc'

107. HENRY I 'Beauclerc'²⁹ of England (King of England) was born in 1068 in Selby, Yorkshire, England.^{873,874} Or perhaps he was born in 1070 in Selby, Yorkshire, England.⁸⁷⁵ He married Matilda of Scotland (Queen Consort of England) (see #108), daughter of Malcolm III 'Canmore' of Scotland (King of Scotland) and Margaret of Scotland (Queen Consort of Scotland), on 11 November 1100 as his first wife.⁸⁷⁶ He married Adeliza of Louvain (Queen Consort of England), daughter of Godfrey I of Louvain (Count of Louvain) and Ida de Chiny and de Namur (Countess Consort of Louvain), on 29 January 1121 as his second wife and her first husband.⁸⁷⁷ He died on 1 December 1135 in Angers, Maine-et-Loire, France.⁸⁷⁸ He was buried in 1135 in Reading Abbey, Reading, Berkshire, England.⁸⁷⁹

He and Matilda of Scotland (Queen Consort of England) were seventh **cousins**. (**Caveat: joining of two ancestral paths**). Their common ancestors were ALFRED 'The Great' of England (King of England) and Ealhswith of Mercia (Queen Consort of England). He and Adeliza of Louvain (Queen Consort of England) were seventh **cousins** once removed. Their common ancestors were ALFRED 'The Great' of England (King of England) and Ealhswith of Mercia (Queen Consort of England). He and Adeliza of Louvain (Queen Consort of England) did not have any children.

King of England, 1100 - 1135

9th Duke of Normandy, 1106 - 1135

HENRY I (1070 - 1135) was King of England, 1100 - 1135. His reign is noted for his opportunistic political skills, the improvements in the machinery of government, the integration of the divided Anglo-Saxon and Normans within his kingdom, his reuniting of the dominions of his father, and his controversial (although well-founded) decision to name his daughter as his heir.

HENRY had at least 21 children by about a dozen mistresses.

Disaster struck when William, his only living legitimate son, perished in the wreck of the White Ship on 25 November 1120 off the coast of Normandy. Also among the dead were two of Henry's illegitimate children, as well as a niece, Lucia-Mahaut de Blois. Henry's grieving was intense, and the succession was in crisis.

HENRY I 'Beauclerc' of England (King of England) and Matilda of Scotland (Queen Consort of England) were grandparents of HENRY II 'Curt Mantel' King of England, 1154 - 1189.

HENRY I 'Beauclerc' of England (King of England) and Norman woman de Caen (Mistress of HENRY I) were maternal ancestors of Governor Thomas Dudley (1576 - 1653) of Yaedley Hastings, Northamptonshire, England and Roxbury, Essex County, Massachusetts.

Children of HENRY I 'Beauclerc'²⁹ of England (King of England) and Matilda of Scotland (Queen Consort of England) (see #108) were as follows:

- i. Richard²⁸ of England (Prince of England) died in his youth.⁸⁸⁰
103. ii. Matilda of England (Holy Roman Empress Consort).
- iii. William 'The Atheling' of England (Prince of England) married Matilda of Anjou, daughter of Fulk V 'The Young' of Jerusalem (King of Jerusalem) and Erembourg of Maine (Queen Consort of Jerusalem), in June 1119.⁸⁸¹ He died on 25 November 1120 in The White Ship Disaster, Barfleur Bay in the English Channel, Normandy, (now France), d.s.p.^{882,883,884}

At the Council of Rheims in 1120, peace was negotiated between LOUIS VI King of France and HENRY I 'Beauclerc' King of England, 1100-1135.

After the Council on 25 November 1120, HENRY I was preparing to sail home to England from Barfleur when a ship's captain approached him claiming that the captain's father had carried HENRY's father to England in 1066 and begging the privilege of carrying HENRY in the captain's splendid new vessel, the 'White Ship'. Since his own ship was already chosen, HENRY granted instead that the 'White Ship' should carry his heir.

When Henry sailed, William 'The Atheling' and his young company were still feasting. So that the crew of the 'White Ship' might join in their revels, casks of wine were sent on board. By the time she put to sea that evening even her pilot was drunk. Beyond Barfleur the 'White Ship' struck a rock, ripped open her hull, filled with water, and heeled over. Hurriedly the captain placed William 'The Atheling' in the only boat, but the boat was submerged by the weight of the panicking crowd that leapt from the listing hull as the 'White Ship' sank. The only survivor was the poorest passenger, a butcher from Rouen.

108. Matilda²⁹ of Scotland (Queen Consort of England) was born in 1079 in Scotland.⁸⁸⁵ She married HENRY I 'Beauclerc' of England (King of England) (see #107), son of WILLIAM I 'The Conqueror' of England (King of England) and Matilda of Flanders (Queen Consort of England), on 11 November 1100 as his first wife.⁸⁸⁶ She died on 1 May 1118.⁸⁸⁷

She was also known as Edith of Scotland. She and HENRY I 'Beauclerc' of England (King of England) were seventh **cousins**. (**Caveat: joining of two ancestral paths**). Their common ancestors were ALFRED 'The Great' of England (King of England) and Ealhswith of Mercia (Queen Consort of England).

Queen Consort of England, 1100 - 1118

Matilda's mother, (Saint) Margaret of Scotland, was a descendant of ALFRED 'The Great' King of England, 871 - 899 and her father was none other than the Malcolm who succeeded Macbeth as King of Scotland, 1058 - 1093. His character makes the final speech in Shakespeare's play: 'Macbeth'.

Matilda sister, Mary, married Eustace III of Boulogne Count of Boulogne.

During her teenage years Matilda was known as Edith, and was a none-too-willing nun in Romsey Abbey, Hampshire, where her aunt was abbess. Her aunt tried to force her to take the veil, but Edith, tore it off and stamped on it behind her aunt's back. But if ever she had unwelcome suitors, she quickly put it back on again, to shoo them away.

She must have thought differently about HENRY King of England, 1100-1135, though, and when she married him, three months after his coronation, she became an excellent consort and provided him with three children.

Matilda of Scotland (Queen Consort of England) and HENRY I 'Beauclerc' of England (King of England) were grandparents of HENRY II 'Curt Mantel' King of England, 1154 - 1189.
